


Briefing notes

Spa 240 - 2024

- 1. Circuit: main informations:
 - Circuit length: 7003.9 m
 - Int 1: 2243.5 m
 - Int 2: 5112.7 m
 - Pit In: 6918.9
 - Pole Positon: left
 - Safety Car station: during the race: T1
 - Red flag line = Start line
 - Finish line, just after T19
 - DC flag display: at chrono line
 - Stop&Go site, pitlane entrance on the right side





Spa Francorchamps Centerline: 7.003,9 m. i1 at 2.243,5 m. i2 at 5.112,7 m. Pit in at 6.918,9 m.

Pit distances

1-F1		388 m	- 23.2s
Indurance-End	durance	338 m.	- 20.3s.
1-Endurance		1003 m	- 60.2s


2. Pitlane

- Pitlane: 1003 m
- The speed limit in the pitlane is <u>60 km/h.</u>






- The white lines (yellow arrows) show the start and end of the pitlane chrono line
- Three obligatory 3-minut pit stops @the box + 60km/h pit lane speed
- 1st stop before 100 min, 2nd between 100 and 200 min, 3rd free choice during the race, done not later than 15 min before the end of the race
- Cars stay in the fast lane until they reach the max Box X-1
- Work has to be carried out on Working Lane only



• When leaving the pitlane, keep to the left until the end of the white line



- 3. Pre-grid / Departure
 - Leading Car in place at exit pitlane Endurance "Eau Rouge"
 - Grid formation @Eau Rouge T-20
 - Be ready in the cars for grid start at T-30 min.
 - Start of formation lap behind Leading Car (2 laps)
 - Chrono starts after first lap
 - Flying start after the second lap
 - End of Zig zag on second lap at T13
 - 2x2 installation from T14 onwards
 - Red light off = start
 - Everyone is allowed to overtake when the lights go out
- 4. Track behaviour
 - Given to the difference in power between the participating cars, mutual respect is essential
 - Slower cars must maintain their trajectory when being overtaken. No sudden changes in trajectory
 - Faster cars must ensure that the car in front is aware of their intention when overtaking.
 - It is forbidden to change trajectory more than once to defend your position

- **5.** FCY
- FCY procedure launched
- Display of FCY signs + yellow flags at all stations
- Max speed 60 km/h (not an average of 60 km/h)
- End of FCY procedure = Green all over the track at the same time
- Failure to comply with FCY = Safety Car!
- 6. Safety Car
 - Safety Car procedure display of "SC" signs and yellow flags at all stations
 - Reduce speed
 - Follow the speed of the Safety Car, max the length of 5 cars between 2 cars
 - No overtaking
 - Safety Car takes to the track in T1
 - All vehicles automatically line up
 - During the entire Safety Car procedure it is mandatory to follow the Safety Car as long as the flashing light is on
 - End of Safety Car procedure, all "SC" signs removed, yellow flags remain
 - Turn off Safety Car flashing light at T13, let SC go
 - The Leader remains at the same speed (without sudden acceleration or braking)
 - When the leader arrives at the chrono line, green flags will be waved everywhere, overtaking authorized for everyone
 - Pitlane exit will be green throughout the procedure

7. Red Flag

- Red flag during practice or qualifying:
 - Immediate speed reduction to max 60 km/h
 - go back to pitlane

• Red flag during the race:

Immediate speed reduction to max 60 km/h Stay on the track, one car behind the other First car stops at "Red Flag" line Condition "Park fermé" for everyone! Timing continues Restart: race resumes behind the Safety Car

- 8. Track Limit (TL)
 - The track is defined between the two white lines
 - At least 2 wheels (on the same side) must remain on the track
 - TL decisions are final
- 9. In case of problems on the runway, try to stop at the posts marked in orange which have an emergency exit to get you back as quickly as possible
- 10. End of Race

At the chequered flag, Endurance pitlane re-enters after the source (T1)

No deceleration lap

- 11. Parc Fermé
 - In the box

12. Alcohol and Doping

- Tolerance 0
- Checks can be carried out at any time, from 3 hours before to 30 minutes after the race

- 13. Epilogue
 - Be respectful of the marshals, they are there for your safety.
 - To the officials who volunteer their time for you to have fun
